Oranga School was established in February 1949 and currently has a roll of approximately 400 year 1–6 students and has a combined staff of approximately 30. The slopes of Maungakiekie connect us not only to our location but also to our turangawaewae (sense of identity). We have extensive learning resources including a library, well-resourced classrooms, extensive digital devices including Chromebooks, ipads and Robotics. We have flexible learning hubs that include open areas for collaborative learning, quiet spaces for independent learning, as well as technology, media, arts, cooking, resource and reading spaces. The school has a garden where our students grow fruit and vegetables, a bike track so that every child has the opportunity to learn to ride a bike and a purpose built where where our students have the opportunity to learn more about a ao, te reo and, tikinga Māori.
